



Concept Development





Construction Design





Trial Places - <1yr





Medium Term Places




The expense of civil works or public-space, road-closure time can be prohibitive for placemaking, however sometimes areas need immediate change.

Permanent Places




Permanent placemaking is the conversion of public space (roads, plazas, parks) into new places. We have lead project management capability for all civil works. We have partner contractors that cover

civil, electrical, storm water, soft fall, playground equipment, ground painting, surveying, lighting, audio, solar and engineering services.



Maintenance Services



The long term success of placemaking can be directly related to how well a place is maintained. We have our own maintenance teams in Sydney and Melbourne. With our wicking and water reservoirs found

in all our green infrastructure to reduce watering requirements and materials chosen for their durability we design to reduce overall maintenance requirements.
